## Syllabus 327 Fall 2022

**Credits**. This is a three credit-hour course. Class meets for two 65-minute sessions of direct instruction for fifteen weeks during the Fall 2022 semester. Please plan for a minimum of six hours of out-of-class work (or homework, study, assignment completion, and class preparation) each week.

Goals. For goals and learning outcomes for this course go to www.math.unm.edu, select "undergraduate" from the top of the page, and then select "program learning goals and outcomes" and click to the rubric of this course.

**Textbook**. There will be no required textbook. Instead I am going to use a set of Notes which I am going to make available at the beginning of the semester. We will cover approximately one half (the first half) of the Notes.

Grading. There will be 1 midterm exam (the date will be announced in class) and a final (comprehensive) exam. The exams will be given in class. They will consist in solving a set of exercises very similar to the ones contained in the homework or solved in class. Homework will be assigned in class every Thursday. A quiz of 10 minutes will be given every Thursday; it will consist of one question that is similar to a homework problem or a problem solved in class. Your final grade will be computed as follows: each of the 2 exams represents 1/3 of the final grade respectively. The quizzes will represent 1/3 of the final grade. The homework will not count towards the grade: it will play the role of practice for the quizzes. The correspondence between your grades expressed in percentages and your grades expressed in letters (A,...F) is defined by a curve that will be discussed in class.

Questions. If you encounter difficulties with your homework please do not hesitate to ask me questions about the homework during the office hours; if you are not available during my office hours please contact me by e-mail and we can make a special appointment. It is important that you attempt to do your homework BEFORE we discuss it during the office hours. Also, note that the material in the lectures and the material in the text are not identical: the material in the lectures is not entirely contained (and does not entirely contain) the material in the text. It is important that you attend the lectures and ALSO independently read the text.
